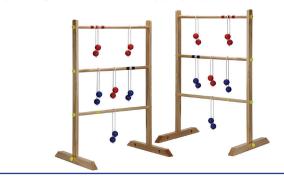


are in four different colours and two jokers. The object of the game is to get rid of your tiles first. Everyone is welcome!
